A N D I E M U S I K

An die Musik, now in its tenth season, is comprised of five distinguished musicians dedicated to chamber music. Acclaimed for its performances both in the United States and abroad, the ensemble was formed in 1976 by pianist Constance Emmerich,

violinist Eliot Chapo, and oboist Gerard Reuter. Its name is drawn from Schober's poem, "A Dedication to Music," set to music by Schubert.

The ensemble has performed an annual series of concerts each season in New York since its beginning, including an appearance at Alice Tully Hall in 1979. In addition to their New York series, the ensemble toured extensively in Europe and the United States.

During the summer of 1980, An die Musik performed in the Lincoln Center Summer Festival Series; in November of 1982, An die Musik was presented by the Kennedy Center as part of the Center's chamber music series, one of the most prestigious in the United States. They were chosen by the Voice of America who recorded their Kennedy Center concert for worldwide broadcast.

During the 1983-84 season, in addition to their New York series at Merkin Concert Hall, An die Musik performed across the United States in major series including Los Angeles, Phoenix, Houston, as well as cities in Oregon, Wyoming, Nebraska, Kansas, Oklahoma and in the eastern United States. The ensemble continued major touring throughout the United States during the 1984-85 season, and a series of chamber music albums to include works of Hayden, Mendelssohn, the Beethoven Piano Quartets, and an album entitled, "An die Musik plays American Music" released by Musical Heritage Society.

ELIOT CHAPO, violinist, has appeared as guest soloist with the Philadelphia Orchestra and Pittsburgh Symphony. He graduated from the Curtis Institute of Music, where he studied with Oscar Shumsky and Efram Zimbalist. Mr. Chapo was Concertmaster of the New York Philharmonic from 1974 to September 1976, having been associate Concertmaster of the Pittsburgh Symphony and Concertmaster of the Pittsburgh Ballet and Opera. He made his solo debut with the New York Philharmonic in April 1974, and was Concertmaster of the Dallas Symphony from 1976 to 1984. Mr. Chapo is presently a Professor of Music at Florida State University in Tallahassee.

RICHARD A. BRICE, violist, joins An Die Musik after resigning his post as Principal Violist of the Munich Chamber Orchestra with whom he toured as soloist throughout Germany, France and Spain. Mr. Brice earned his Bachelor's and Master's degrees at the Juilliard School, studying with William Lincer and chamber music with the Juilliard Quartet. While attending the High School of Music and Art, he studied with Eugene Becker of the New York Philharmonic. Mr. Brice was previously Principal Violist of the Southwest German Philharmonic and Associate Principal Violist of the Orquestra Sinfonica of Venezuela in Caracas and violist of the Quartetto Nacional de Venezuela.

Etlar and Hindemith, she became Artist-in-Residence at
Yaddo in Saratoga Springs. Mrs. Emmerich has toured
extensively in the major cities of the United States.

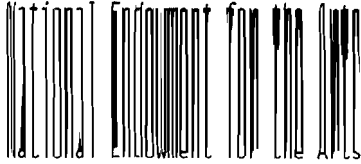

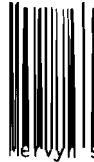
