LONDON VIRTUOSI

With their unusual combination of instruments, the LONDON VIRTUOSI can draw on countless varieties of sounds and programs. The key to their success is a mixture of flute, oboe, violin, viola, cello, keyboard and infectious enjoyment.

All of the VIRTUOSI'S members are well known in their own right:

JOHN GEORGIADIS—Concert master of the London Symphony Orchestra since 1965. He was the soloist in the first English performance of Menotti's Violin Concerto and in the first London performance of Bartok's Violin Concerto No. 1.

BRIAN HAWKINS—Principal viola with the London Sinfonietta as well as a regular performer with the Academy of St. Martin-in-the-Fields and the English Chamber Orchestra.

EDWARD BECKET—Has been acclaimed an "exquisite flutist."

ANTHONY CAMDEN—Co-principal oboe of the London Symphony who plays the cor anglais and oboe d'amore as well

DOUGLAS CUMMINGS—At the age of 23 became the principal cellist of the London Symphony, the youngest incumbent ever of that position. In 1970 he was the soloist in the world premiere of Andre Previn's Cello Concerto.

DAVID LUMSDEN—Harpsichordist, is first professor of music at Oxford University and a lecturer of Baroque music. Their London debut in the fall of 1972 resulted in a five-year contract to make 30 recordings. Their first release was voted one of the four best of the year by "HI-FI News." Currently on their first American Tour, they will travel to Hong Kong, Austria, South Africa and South America later this year.
